#### **Qualification Requirements**

To assure equitable classification and handicapping, a specific number of targets must be shot in 2022 and 2023 combined with a certain minimum of them being shot in 2022, prior to July 27, 2023.

#### Penalty classes and Handicap Yardage

Those not meeting the target requirements shall be assigned penalty class and yardage as follows.

	Total in 2022/2023	Minimum 2023	Class/ Ydg.
16 Yard	800	400	Class A
Handicap	800	400	See Below
Doubles	400	200	Class B

For women and sub-juniors, the minimum shall be class B singles and Class C in Doubles respectively.

NOTE: PENALTY YARDAGE WILL BE AS FOLLOWS: YOUR CUR-RENT ATA ASSIGNED YARDAGE PLUS A MINIMUM OF TWO (2) YARDS TO A MAXIMUM OF 25 YARDS. Example: Shooter A: ATA assigned yardage is 22 yards, plus the two (2) yard penalty; The shooter shoots from the twenty-four (24) yard line. Penalty yardage is waived for Senior Veterans.

Earned yardage awarded will be based on number of shooters at site. Ties in the singles and doubles events on Friday will be carried over to the next like event (both Club and Zone). All Zone winners and ties in each class will be moved up a class for Saturday's Singles and Sunday's Doubles events (based on Zone winners). Zone Handicap trophies are shot off following the day's events.

If not decided by Zone Banking, ties for Club Handicap trophies will be decided by reverse 25's on that event. If still tied, trophy will be decided by coin flip done by the office staff. If CLUB Singles and Doubles are still tied after carry-over, trophies will be decided in the same manner as handicap ties.

This is an invitational tournament and the Directors of the NTA reserve the authority to reject, refund, or disqualify any contestant who, in its judgment, interferes with the conduct, accuracy or sportsmanship of the shoot. in event of a dispute over interpretation of any part of this program, the decision of the Directors shall govern. By entering the tournament, contestants agree to abide by all rules of the ATA and NTA, and to abide by all decisions of the Directors.

It is the shooters responsibility to make sure that all special categories (Lady 1, Lady 2, Sub-juniors, Junior, Junior Gold, Sub Veterans, Veterans, and Senior Vets are declared special category at the time of classification in any registered tournament if they wish to compete as a category shooter. Without such declaration the contestant will not be allowed to compete for the applicable category trophy. No contestant will be allowed to declare or change a special category after firing his/her first shot. The only exception to this rule will be to correct an ATA classification error. The following rules apply to shooters who have declared a special category. At all tournaments where All American points will be awarded in any event, shooters may declare only one (1) category (ie. Lady 1, Lady 2, Sub Junior, Junior, Junior Gold, Sub Veteran, Veteran, and Senior Veteran) Note: Chair shooters are exempt from this rule. Lady I, Lady II, Junior Gold, Junior, Sub Junior, Sub Veteran, Veteran, Senior Veteran must be marked on all entry cards and the bulletin board. Shooters are responsible for seeing that this is done at both places. All around scores are recorded by the computer; check your scores at the scoreboard.

He loved shooting trap and all the people we met, travelled, competed, and became friends with. Our fellow trapshooters were our family too. Thank you to the Board of Directors; Tom would be so very pleased and proud, as we sure are.

# 2023 HONOREE TOM BUXMAN

Tom was an All American Trapshooter, competing in trapshooting events for some 50 years, registering 156,450 Singles, 193,850 Handicap and 99,200 Doubles targets. He was inducted into the Nebraska Hall of Fame, including five berths on the Men's All-American team, plus four as a Vet and one as a Senior Vet. He was on the Nebraska State Team for several years. His state titles were two Handicap, two Doubles and one All-Around. He was the 92nd shooter to complete his Grand Slam, breaking the 100 straight in the Handicap in 1990.

Two of Tom's most prestigious trophies were the 1997 Spring Grand Singles Championship and the 1999 Central Zone Singles Championship. Seventeen shooters broke the 200 Singles at the Spring Grand that year. Tom ran 150 extras to win, shooting two of his targets as they flew into the full moon that was rising in the evening horizon. He said later, "I shot the moon twice!" At the Central Zone he broke all the Singles in the program that week as well as 300 straight in the shoot off to win the Central Zone Singles Championship.

In 1988 at the Spring Grand in Phoenix, his Model 12 and Marge's 1100 were both stolen from their truck during the Calcutta. Tom missed that Model 12 until the Alfermann twins made him his pride and joy, the Alfermann #9 shotgun.

Tom's passion was shooting, whether it was a Trapshooting event or Turkey Shoots. He loved the completion and comradery. When both of his shoulders broke down from torn off rotator cuffs, the doctor told him both shoulders had to be replaced. He told Tom he could not guarantee that he would be able to shoot again, especially with the same quality and quantity Tom would want. The doctor told him to buy a fishing pole and go fishing instead of shooting trap. Tom complained often, telling people the doctor refused to fix his shoulders; however, he did buy a boat and really did enjoy going fishing. Recently we learned that during the Colorado State Shoot one year, Tom and a fellow shooter missed shoot offs three nights in row because they were fishing. Obviously, the transition was not that hard.

In between events at a Trapshoot, often you would find Tom at a card table either playing hearts or gin rummy. He also helped set targets and repaired trap machines. Tom would help any shooter that was struggling, by standing behind them at the practice trap and offering advice. He coached new shooters at the local gun club as well his kids and grandkids, especially focusing on gun safety. The first Christmas present he bought his wife, Marge, was a shotgun. Tom taught her how to shoot and was especially proud when she broke a higher score than he did.

Tom did not know a stranger, he visited with everybody. All loved to hear his stories, he had a story for every occasion, and we all loved hearing them, even if it was over and over again.
